BRIDGE (National Center to BRIDGE Domestic Violence, Child Protection and Custody)

– To establish a national resource center that provides training, technical assistance, policy and systems support, and research to help domestic violence providers, child welfare agencies, and courts strengthen coordination and improve safe, survivor-centered responses when domestic violence intersects with child protection and custody systems. Over five years, BRIDGE will produce 30–60 resources, deliver at least 25 trainings, and train approximately 6,000 professionals nationwide who support domestic violence survivors and their children.

Project Abstract

Child Trends, in partnership with the Center for Justice Innovation (CJI) and Wings of Change (WoC), proposes the National Center to BRIDGE Domestic Violence, Child Protection and Custody (BRIDGE), a national Special Issue Resource Center (SIRC) focused on domestic violence (DV) responses at the intersection of child protection and custody (CPC). BRIDGE will provide information and training and technical assistance (TTA) to state and local DV providers to strengthen their capacity to work with child welfare, courts, and other systems that make consequential decisions about survivors and their children. BRIDGE will also support professionals and systems in applying DV-informed approaches that promote safety, family stability, economic independence, and accountability. The need for information and TTA is practical and applicable across systems. Survivors and their children may simultaneously navigate DV services, child protective services, custody and family court proceedings, parenting time, child support, and other family-serving systems. These systems often operate under different mandates, timelines, legal standards, and understandings of safety. DV providers need practical guidance and TTA to help survivors navigate these intersections, while CPC professionals need tools to recognize coercive control, understand protective strategies, assess risks to children and parents, hold the person using violence accountable, and avoid responses that increase harm. BRIDGE will serve state and local DV programs and coalitions nationwide, child welfare agencies, courts, Tribal partners, community-based organizations, and other partners whose decisions affect survivor and child safety.

BRIDGE will provide four interconnected core functions: (1) develop and disseminate practical resources and emerging-issue guidance; (2) deliver nationwide, needs-driven training, consultation, peer learning, and tailored TTA informed by ongoing needs assessment and survivor feedback; (3) work with public and private systems to identify service and accessibility gaps and strengthen policies, protocols, training, and cross-system responses; and (4) synthesize evidence, identify knowledge gaps, assess promising practices and partnerships, conduct applied research and evaluation, and translate findings into practical guidance. Key research questions will examine how CPC policies and practices may create safety risks or fail to protect survivors and children when DV is present, how systems can enable continued coercive control after separation, and which policies and practices support survivor and child safety, family stability, economic self-sufficiency, and safe parent-child relationships when appropriate.

BRIDGE is purpose-built for this cross-system challenge, combining prior CPC SIRC leadership, national DV expertise, court and custody TTA, child welfare expertise, applied research, and federal center infrastructure. Its field-driven model moves survivor and provider input, TTA trends, system needs, and emerging evidence quickly into practical resources, training, policy guidance, and research. Across five years, BRIDGE will produce 30-60 research and TTA products, deliver at least 25 trainings and presentations, and train approximately 6,000 people nationwide. Together, these elements position BRIDGE to strengthen national capacity for safer, more coordinated responses to DV in CPC.
